For our December playing meeting, we will meet at Carol Woods in Chapel Hill. The meeting will include group playing of holiday music from our anthologies and special notebooks, and our Christmas goody feast.

Bring your Christmas anthologies (there are three that we've been using) and also your favorite holiday treats to share with the group. If you don't have the anthologies there will be extras for you to play from.

Here are the pieces that we might end up playing:

Vol. 1, pp 2-3, 8-9 (less likely), 10-11, 18-19, 24-27
Vol. 2, pp 7, 10-11, 16-17, 18-19 (slightly harder), 22-23, 25, 26

The pieces are from Eric Haas's *The Christmas Collection* vols. 1 & 2, which many TRS members have. If you need copies, please or contact Pat.

Please invite your family and friends to attend this special Sunday afternoon playing meeting. We will begin at 2:30 and end at 5:00, with a break for treats in the middle. Guests may come and go as they please!

Location and directions: From Raleigh, take I-40 to the NC 86 exit; turn left on 86, go less than a mile to Weaver Dairy Road (a stop light just past a shopping plaza), turn left; Carol Woods is on the left, about a mile past the Tymberline Shopping Center. From the parking lot, follow the covered walkway to the main building, and look for signs. From Durham, take 15-501 to I-40 West, and proceed as above.

Food: This month, you are invited to bring a holiday treat to share (dessert, appetizer, home-made, deli-prepared, whatever makes your mouth water), and we will set up a covered-dish treat table for you.
