Pass the light at Northbrook Dr. and immediately turn left into St. Marks' parking lot. Come in the black glass doors of the main building and look for signs.

From Highway 70, just past the Crabtree Valley Shopping Center, take I-440 North towards Wake Forest and Rocky Mount and follow the directions from *, above.

TEMPO Concert Series

A new series of "occasional" concerts of early music—music of the baroque, early classical, renaissance, and medieval periods in Europe—will make its debut this Fall at First Presbyterian Church of Durham, 305 E. Main Street in downtown Durham.

The next concert will be on Sunday, November 25th at 3:00 pm, and will feature music for baroque trumpets, organ and percussion, with **The Clarino Consort**, including works by Handel, Telemann, and Charpentier.

Admission will be \$16 general public, \$10 students, cash or check only at the door. Advance reservations are not required.

Last month, many Recorder Society members enjoyed the wonderful music of the Ensemble Caprice on October 20th. Matthias Maute, Susie Napper, and Dongsok Shin were incredible performers who entertained us with beautiful music from the baroque period including pieces from Ortiz, van Eyck, Handel, and Marais. "The amazingly complex musical and technical requirements" of the music presented a level of skill that many of us only hope to achieve, but which give us something to strive for in the future.
