From the parking lot, follow the covered walkway to the main building, and look for signs. From Durham, take 15-501 to I-40 West, and proceed as above.

Costs: For members, meeting fees are \$5.00. For non-members, the first visit is free; subsequent meetings are \$7.00. The pricing for our newest anthology will be announced, and it should be under \$15.
